Commissioning of Any Qualified Providers (AQPs) to deliver Children’s Continuing Care Services in Milton Keynes

From the 1st of April 2026 the East of England Community Health and Care NHS Trust are responsible for the development, coordination and management of Continuing Care packages in Milton Keynes. This will be delivered in line with the National Framework for Children and Young People’s (CYP’s) Continuing Care and the local Children’s Continuing Care Policy of Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes’ Integrated Care Board (BLMK ICB). The aim is to deliver a community-based Continuing Care Service for CYP from birth until their 18th birthday, who are deemed eligible for support. This is to enable their assessed needs to be met and promote optimum health and wellbeing. This will be delivered by ensuring the packages are specific and personalised to meet the needs of each child/ young person and their family, through the commissioning of Any Qualified Providers (AQPs) to deliver the care packages.

This responsibility was held from the 1st October 2022, by Cambridgeshire Community Services NHS Trust and transferred into East of England Community Health and Care NHS Trust in April 2026.
